



From Your Favorite Pastor

As we head into summer, many people start thinking about vacation or getting away to cabins and retreats. For churches, we start thinking about VBS. This ministry is one that impacts the church in a great deal of ways. A recent study showed that VBS is one of the most effective ways to reach youth in the community surrounding the local church. It's also one of the most effective ways of getting a lot of people in the church involved in ministry. The study went on to show that VBS had a lasting impact on the kids and families that attended that were unchurched. This is one of the most important things to take away from this: *the unchurched*.

The largest segment in our population today are those that have no experience in church! These are people who weren't raised in a church, typically don't even have family members in church, and don't even set foot in one for weddings or funerals. In Michigan, the largest *religious affiliation* group is the "nones" (unchurched): 23.5% of the population. As we know from our study in Acts a while back, the church has a mission: Love God, love others, and make disciples. We also know from studies that our chances to reach the unchurched youth in our communities decreases rapidly after age 13. In fact, the studies show that over 90% of believers make that choice BEFORE age 13!

VBS is one of the biggest opportunities we have to reach the kids in our local community. It is one of the few chances we have as a church to teach them about Christ and possibly lead them to their eternal salvation through Him. As we head toward our VBS this June, remember we need everyone in the church participating in one of the most important ministries that we have, one that Jesus called us to during His time here on earth.



Does the Bible Demean Women?

The Bible does not demean women. Scripture honors women of all walks of life, including single women, widows, wives, mothers, homemakers, businesswomen, and spiritual leaders like Deborah. Unfortunately, many people have taken Bible passages out of context in order to control and abuse women. This exploitation contradicts the Lord's plan for His people and deeply grieves His heart.

God created Eve as the finishing touch of His creation. He took one of Adam's ribs and specially crafted Eve from it as a helper suitable for Adam, a perfect counterpart for him (Genesis 2:18, 21-22). The Bible says God created men and women in His image, according to His likeness (Genesis 1:26-27). Men and women are equal in God's kingdom; yet they possess distinct roles and strengths.

In the Garden of Eden, the serpent deceived Eve, and she ate the fruit of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. Adam ate also. As part of the curse for this sin, God announced to Eve, "Your desire will be for your husband, yet he will dominate you" (Genesis 3:16). Throughout history, passages like this have been wrongly used to suggest that women are inferior to men. Commonly abused texts include:

"the man is the head of the woman" (I Corinthians 11:3)

"It is disgraceful for a woman to speak in the church meeting" (I Corinthians 14:35)

"Wives, submit to your own husbands as to the Lord" (Ephesians 5:22)

"I do not allow a woman to teach or to have authority over a man; instead, she is to be silent" (I Timothy 2:12)

While wives are instructed to respect and submit to their husbands, husbands are also instructed to love, lead, protect, and provide for their wives. The husband's leadership is not to be domineering, but loving, as Christ loves the church and gave His life for it. Sharon James notes, "The Bible explains the meaning behind gender distinctions. Masculine strength can be protection and provision. Many women are gifted with a 'helper design' – relational capacities to nurture and care' (Does the Bible Demean Women?" in the Apologetics Study Bible).

The Bible mentions many influential, godly women who held crucial roles in ministry. Some from the Old Testament such as Rahab and Esther, played crucial roles in helping God's people. From the New Testament, some women supported Jesus and the disciples; others furthered the gospel through prayer, financial support, acts of mercy, and other ministries. All of these women were commended for their important contributions to God's kingdom work. They include:

To fully answer the question, "Does the Bible demean women?" we really must ask, 'Did Jesus demean women?" As God incarnate, He did not demean women. Rather, He powerfully affirmed their worth. He demonstrated love and compassion to women and engaged them in discussions about relationships and other significant issues (Matthew 9:22; John 4:7-29). In fact, the level of interaction He had with women shocked His disciples and the religious leaders of His day. Jesus Christ valued and affirmed women, and He is our ultimate example.


Please help us bless these children and their communities across the globe!

HOT HAM AND PINEAPPLE CAMPFIRE SANDWICHES



These Hot Ham and Pineapple Campfire Sandwiches are a delicious and easy tin foil recipe. Plus cleanup is a breeze! (You can even bake these in the oven too!)

INGREDIENTS

- 6 Rhodes Artisan French Rolls, thawed to room temperature
- 9 oz deli sliced ham
- 6 pineapple rings, cut in half if desired
- 6 slices cheddar cheese
- ♦ 2 Tbsp Dijon mustard
- 1 Tbsp honey

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Cut rolls in half. Mix the Dijon mustard with the honey and spread the bottom of each roll with some of the honey-mustard mixture.
- 2. Layer each sandwich as follows: Fold a few pieces of ham and place it on top of the honey-mustard. Top the ham with a pineapple ring, cut in half, if desired. Top pineapple with a slice of cheddar cheese, and the top half of the roll.
- 3. Wrap each sandwich well with heavy-duty aluminum foil. Place the sandwiches over hot coals or a grill rack

until hot, about 20 minutes depending upon the temperature of your fire. Alternatively, you can bake these sandwiches directly on top of the center rack in a 400 degree Fahrenheit oven for 15 minutes.

Carefully unwrap and enjoy!



Bacon Ranch Chicken Foil Packets INGREDIENTS

6 tablespoons butter melted 2 tablespoons ranch seasoning powder salt and pepper to taste

4 medium sized chicken breasts approximately 4 ounces each

1 pound small red potatoes halved or quartered nonstick cooking spray

1 cup shredded cheddar cheese

4 slices bacon cooked and crumbled

2 tablespoons chopped parsley

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat the oven to 425 degrees or a grill over medium high heat. In a small bowl whisk together the butter, ranch seasoning, and salt and pepper to taste.
- 2. Coat 4 large squares of foil with cooking spray.
- 3. Place the potatoes in a bowl and drizzle with 4 tablespoons of the ranch butter over the top. Toss to coat evenly.
- 4. Place a chicken breast onto each of the foil squares and season with salt and pepper to taste. Divide the potatoes evenly among the 4 foil squares and arrange them around the chicken.
 - 5. Drizzle the remaining 2 tablespoons of butter over the chicken breasts. Fold the edges of the foil over the chicken and potatoes to make a packet.
 - 6. Bake for 45 minutes or grill for 30 minutes. Open the packets and sprinkle the cheese over the chicken and potatoes. Leave the packets open and return to the oven or grill for 2-3 minutes or until cheese melts. Sprinkle with bacon and parsley and serve.
