


We are about to celebrate the birth of our nation and have just had the 79th anniversary of the D-Day invasion landings that were part of Operation Overlord. Most people know the basics of the invasion: 156,000 troops landed on 5 beaches, 7,000 ships involved, 10,000 vehicles, 4,400 allied forces died, and this was all just on June 6. The troops involved had been training for several months in secret, most of them not entirely sure what they were training for. They knew what everyone around the world knew, that the allies were going to invade Western Europe at some point if they were to defeat the Nazi's. While the invasion of Italy had already happened, most agreed that the turning point in the war were the Normandy landings. There are thousands of stories that have never been heard of about incredible feats men accomplished that day to secure a foothold in Europe. Most people also know of the bloodiness of the invasion, seeing it in movies and pictures. But did you know that most of the blood spilt that day was on one beach? Around 4,000 men were killed or wounded on Omaha beach, with one unit in the initial landing losing 90%. To contrast that, the casualties on Gold beach were 80% lower. The really difficult part of the entire invasion was the understanding that it was just the first day and that the battle had just begun (the continued movement into Europe took significantly longer than anticipated).

While all this was going on, the news of the invasion was starting to reach the states. Time magazine put it this way, "Across the land, generally, the mood was solemn. There was no sudden fear, as on that September morning in 1939 when the Germans marched into Poland; no sudden hate, as on Pearl Harbor day. This time, moved by a common impulse, the casual churchgoers as well as the devout went to pray. The U.S. people had wondered for weeks how they would behave on D-day. When it came, they went about their regular business. Race tracks called off their programs for the day; many stores closed at noon. The citizens stuck to their radios, read newspaper extras as they rolled off the presses, sat and thought, stood and drank, knelt and prayed." This invasion was impacting the entire world just as the war had been. But everyone knew it was necessary to defeat the evil that was trying to take over everything people held dear. So why do I bring this up?

I believe we are in a similar battle today. The enemy, Satan, is trying to conquer and destroy all that we hold dear. He wants to keep our kids, spouses, parents, neighbors, friends, and co-workers from Jesus. This is being done through an evil onslaught of the culture that hasn't really been seen before through the woke culture, human trafficking, and the LGBT activists. Every believer in Jesus Christ is being called to duty to fight this battle for the sharing of the message of the Gospel. In Ephesians 6, Paul lays out what we need to do to take this on. "Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power.¹¹ Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes.¹² For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms.¹³ Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand.¹⁴ Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, ¹⁵ and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. ¹⁶ In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one.¹⁷ Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. ¹⁸ And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people." Ephesians 6:10-18

Are UFOs Real? By Mark Matlock Apologetics Bible pg. 840

Yes, UFOs are real. But before we go any further, let me define UFO. A UFO is an Unidentified Flying Object, where *unidentified* simply means the eyewitnesses could not identify what they saw! With today's advanced technology, it's no surprise that people sometimes see unidentified objects. This probably isn't what you had in mind though. To most people, a UFO sighting implies visitors from another planet. In the past, you would have been labeled crazy for claiming to have seen a UFO, but today it is more acceptable to believe in life on other planets, making the UFO question important for Christians. Here are some points to consider.

First, the Bible doesn't speak about life on other planets. Any time the Bible is silent on an issue, I take notice. If God wanted us to know whether life exists elsewhere, He would have revealed it in His Word. His silence on this topic should cause us all to be humble and cautious when forming an opinion. The Bible is the story of God's redemption of humankind. It is not meant to be the source of all knowledge.

Some have interpreted certain passages to give the impression that UFOs are indeed mentioned in the Bible. In Exodus God led the people of Israel via a cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night (Exodus 13:21-22). Some UFO enthusiasts suggest these were spacecraft! Still others say passages in Ezekiel describing a vision of wheels within a wheel (Ezekiel 1:15-21) refers to flying saucers. Proper methods of interpretation do not allow these passages to be interpreted this way.

Second, if there were proof that life exists on other planets, it would not harm Christian beliefs. While biblical silence about life beyond earth may suggest it's unlikely, this does not rule out with certainty that life exists elsewhere. If it does, we know that this life, too, was created by God, for God is the Creator of the entire universe, not just our small corner of it.

Scripture is silent about many created beings we humans have discovered in recent centuries such as creatures living in the dark depths of the ocean. Furthermore, angels exist, but they are not usually part of our plane of existence. What is important is the possibility of life elsewhere is not inconsistent with the Christian faith.

Third, the Bible tells us that Satan 'is disguised as an angel of light" (2 Corinthians 11:14). In the garden of Eden, he disguised himself as a serpent (Genesis 3). For this reason, we must be cautious. If ever we do encounter aliens from another planet, we must bear in mind that Satan and demons may disguise themselves in order to deceive us. So, just as we do with any angel or human being we encounter, we must be sure his message is consistent with the message of the gospel (Galatians 1:8)



Cauliflower "potato" salad

Ingredients:

- 1. 2 1/2 cup cauliflower, cooked and chopped (5 Greens)
- 2. 1/2 cup celery, chopped (1 Green)
- 3. 2 hard boiled egg, chopped (2/3 Lean)
- 4. 3 tbsp light mayo (2 Healthy Fats)
- 5. 2 tsp dijon mustard (2 Condiments)
- 6. 1/4 tsp salt (1 Condiment)
- 7. 1/4 tsp onion powder (1/2 Condiment)
- 8. 1/8 tsp black pepper (1/4 Condiment)
- 9. sprinkle of paprika

Directions:

- Steam cauliflower until it reaches the same texture as cooked potatoes.
- Rinse in cold water to cool; pat with paper towel until dry.
- Chop the cauliflower into small bites. Mix into a bowl with celery and eggs, Add mayo, mustard, salt onion power, and pepper. Mix well. Sprinkle with paprika.
 - Chill for 1 hour.
 - 2 Servings [each serving = 1/3 Lean, 3 Greens, 2 Condiments, and 1 Healthy Fat]

Pickle Juice Air Fried Chicken 💷

Ingredients for 1 serving:

1. Leftover pickle juice

2. 9.1 oz Chicken breast (to yield 6 oz cooked- 1 leaner)

- 3. 3 Tbsp liquid egg substitute (1 condiment)
- 4. 1.5 Tbsp Almond flour (1 healthy fat)
- 5. 2 Tbsp Parmesan cheese (2 condiments)
- 6. Pepper

Directions:

The day before, place Raw chicken in a bowl and fill it with pickle juice. Make sure it covers the breast.

- Marinate in refrigerator overnight.
- Preheat the air fryer to 400 for 5 min.
- Mix the pepper, almond flour, and parmesan cheese in a bowl.
- Place the egg substitute in another bowl.
- Take each piece of chicken and pat dry.
- Dip the chicken in the egg wash and let drain off a bit.
- Then batter the chicken in the mixture of almond flour and cheese.
- Spray a piece of parchment paper with nonstick spray and place the chicken on it then into the air fryer.

Air Fry at 400 degrees for 15-18 min flipping when about 5 min left.
