From your Favorite Pastor







Apologetics

Are There Contradictions in the Bible?



Skeptics say the Bible contains contradictions. If true, this would suggest it is not inspired by God, since God is all-knowing. However, close examination reveals that the Bible doesn't contain actual contradictions.

A writer is guilty of contradiction when he or she affirms two facts both of which can't possibly be true at the same time and in the same manner. It is not so easy to establish that a writer is guilty of this. For example, it would seemingly be a contradiction to say, "The apple is red and the apple is not red." But what if the author was referring to two different apples and didn't bother spelling out that fact? Or, perhaps he was referring to the skin first and then the pulp. Or, maybe he described the apple over a span of time, from when it was ripe and red to when it was rotted and brown. You see that we must have a lot of information before we can conclude that an actual contradiction is present, and writers often don't supply more than bare details. We should presume innocence until guilt is proven. Those who claim the Bible contains contradictions must prove the statements in question could not be resolved by additional information.





CREAMY TACO SOUP

Ingredients:

- 1. 2 lbs. ground beef or turkey
- 2. 4 oz reduced-fat cream cheese
- 3. 1 cup low-fat plain Greek yogurt
- 4. 2-10 oz cans of Rotel diced tomatoes
- 5. 1 Tbsp Taco seasoning
- 6. 4 cups low sodium beef/chicken/vegetable broth
- 7. 1-2 TBSP fresh cilantro
- 8. 1/2 cup shredded cheese for topping.

Instructions:

- Brown ground meat until fully cooked.
- While the meat is browning, place cream cheese, tomatoes, and taco seasoning into the crockpot.
- Drain any grease off the meat and add meat to the crockpot. Stir to combine.
- Pour broth into the crockpot, and stir.
- Cook on low for 4 hrs. or high for 2 hrs.
- Add Greek yogurt & cilantro* last, heat through, and serve.
- Top with shredded cheese.

Makes 6 servings. Per serving: 1 lean protein, 1 green, 3 condiments. *Add 2 more greens* for a complete meal.





Baked Cinnamon Jicama (Apple like desert)

Ingredients:

3 cups (13.74 oz) jicama peeled and cubed, smaller cubes better, or sliced thin (6 Greens) 3 tbsp light Land O' Lakes Butter with Canola Oil, melted (3 Healthy Fats) 1/4 tsp apple pie spice (1/2 Condiment) 1/4 tsp ground cinnamon (1/2 Condiment)

3 packets stevia in the raw (3 Condiments)

Optional Toppings:

2 tbsp Walden Farms caramel syrup (1 Condiment) 2 tbsp Fat-Free Reddi Whip (1 Condiment)

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line a cookie sheet or baking pan with non-stick foil.

Mix jicama with melted butter in a mediumsized bowl. Add cinnamon, apple pie spice, and stevia stirring until combined. Pour onto a foil-lined pan. Cover with foil. Bake for 20 minutes. Uncover and bake for an additional 15 minutes.

The jicama will not get completely soft when baking. Expect to have a slightly crisp center when eating and a slightly sweetened taste. Enjoy!
