

From Your Favorite Pastor



This is quite a time in the world. As I sit here, Israel has not only been fighting Hamas for over six months but also endured an unprecedented attack by Iran. With all this going on, many are asking about how this plays into end times prophecy. If you search for answers you will find that there is an abundance of opinions out there. I'll share mine briefly, but then include what I think is probably the most important part.

PT, is all this the beginning of the end? Short answer, I don't know. Anyone that claims to know is a false prophet and isn't following the Bible as we are told by Christ that no one knows the day or hour (Matthew 24:36). I will say this *could* be the beginning of the end. As we wait for Israel to respond to Iran militarily, their action could very easily be the catalyst for a wider conflict in the region and even the world. The prophet Ezekiel talks about much of this, and Pastor Jack Hibbs mentioned this could be the "hook in the jaw of Gog" to come down and attack Israel with Iran and other nations (Ez. 37-39). I remind you that no one knows until it actually happens.

I add into this uncertain situation the problems within our own country. While we are in the midst of our Living in Babylon series, I have been somewhat discouraged to realize how much we are like Judah when it faced judgment from God. We see crazy things happening in schools, Boeing being accused of poor safety protocols because of DEI, and people in this country being arrested for their exercise of the First Amendment. I HIGHLY ENCOURAGE you to attend our showing of the movie *Letter to the American Church* by Eric Metaxas on April 28 (free event). This is based off of his book by the same name, which lays out how much we are like 1930's Germany as the Nazi's rose to power. I believe you will be very surprised by the correlations happening. Invite people from other churches as well to come as the entire Church of Christ needs to rise up to fight the evil being pushed upon us.

I will close with encouragement for you: Christ wins in the end! We are on the winning side, even as we seem to be facing increasingly insurmountable odds. If you are curious how the story turns out, read Revelation 19-22. Our job until that time is to keep seeking Christ and loving others well while we speak the truth of God's Word (Mark 12:29-31; 1 Peter 3:15-16; Jude), and to ask the Spirit to make us like the sons of Issachar who understood the times and what to do (1 Chronicles 12:32).

This month's homework: read all the Scriptures listed and come to the movie on April 28 @ 7pm here at church. The country is at a crossroads and the church needs to rise up.

Jeremiah 1:5

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew^[a] you,
before you were born I set you apart;
I appointed you as a prophet to the nations."

The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints (Mormons) teach that all people lived in God's presence in a "preexistent" state before they were born into this world. To support this view, Mormons claim from Jeremiah 1:5 that God had a relationship with Jeremiah (and all other humans) before birth. Similarly, Eastern religions teach that souls move from one body to the next in a process called reincarnation. Is it possible that our souls existed previous to our life on earth? Not according to Jeremiah 1:5 or any other passage in the Bible. First, notice that God is the one who chose, set apart, and appointed Jeremiah to be a prophet. The sovereign God knew Jeremiah, but nowhere does it say that Jeremiah knew God in the same way in some previous live. Additionally, the Bible says "now is the day of salvation" and "it is appointed for people to die once – and after this, judgement" (2 Corinthians 6:2; Hebrews 9:27). Therefore, the soul's preexistence and reincarnation are not Christian beliefs.

Jeremiah 10:3-4
"For the practices of the peoples are worthless;
they cut a tree out of the forest,
and a craftsman shapes it with his chisel.
They adorn it with silver and gold;
they fasten it with hammer and nails
so it will not totter."

Are Christmas trees pagan? These verses have sometimes been used to say it is wrong to have a decorated tree at Christmastime. After all, the cut tree described in this passage is decorated with silver and gold in the same way that tinsel and gold stars decorate many Christmas trees each holiday season. As always, we must examine the immediate context of this passage in order to fully understand its meaning and implications. When we consider the context, it is obvious that pagan idols rather than Christmas trees are referenced in this passage. Indeed, it says that the idols "cannot speak" or "do any good" (vs 5) Verse 8 adds that these "worthless idols" are "stupid and foolish," Yet verse 10 says that "Yahweh is the true God." While we can make anything into an idol, perhaps even Christmas trees, it should also be pointed out that Jeremiah would not have known anything about Christmas trees since they did not become a tradition until the sixteenth century in Europe.


GARAGE SALE DATE AND LOCATION CHANGE!!!

BBQ Chicken & Ranch Broccoli Salad

1 leaner - 3 Green - 1 Healthy fat -

3 Condiments (per serving)

4 servings

Ingredients:

- 4, (6-oz.) boneless, skinless chicken breasts
- 1 tbsp no sugar added BBQ seasoning
- 6 cups broccoli florets
- ³/₄ cup reduced-fat Greek yogurt
- 2 tbsp regular mayo
- 1 tbsp homemade ranch seasoning (recipe in directions)

Directions:

- 1. Preheat the grill.
- 2. Pound chicken to even thickness, and season with BBQ seasoning.
- 3. Grill chicken until internal temperature of 165°F, about 4 to 6 minutes per side depending on the thickness.
- 4. To make the homemade ranch seasoning: Combine 2 tbsp dried parsley, 1 tbsp dried dill, 1 tbsp dried chives, 1 tbsp garlic powder, 1 tbsp onion powder, 2 tsp salt, and 1 tsp black pepper in a spice grinder. Pulse 5 to 7 times to enhance the taste and texture of the seasoning mix.

Alternatively, you can mix all of the dried herbs and spices in a bowl. Store in an air-tight container until ready to use.

- 5. In a large bowl, combine the broccoli, yogurt, mayo, and ranch seasoning. Toss well.
- 6. Each serving should have 6 ounces of cooked chicken and 1½ cups of broccoli salad.



Waffled Tuna Melt

1 leanest - 3 Green - 2 Healthy fat - 2 Condiment (per serving)

Ingredients:

- 4½ ounces canned tuna packed in water
- 1½ ounces eggs
- 2 tablespoons low-fat cream cheese at room temperature
- ½ cup minced celery
- 2 scallions minced

½ tsp salt

1 pinch ground black pepper

• 2 tablespoons reduced-fat cheddar cheese

Cooking spray

1½ cups romaine lettuce cut into ¼ inch strips

1 tbsp ranch dressing

Directions:

- 1. Drain the tuna from its water.
- 2. In a mixing bowl, combine the cream cheese and eggs with a whisk and mix until thoroughly combined.
- 3. Combine the tuna with the egg-cream cheese mix and stir in the celery, scallions, salt, pepper and cheese.
- 4. Preheat a waffle iron and spray both sides with the cooking spray.
- 5. Put an adequate amount of the tuna mix on your waffle iron (the amount may vary depending on the waffle iron's size), and cook until golden brown for about 15 minutes.
- 6. Once done remove the tuna waffles from the waffle iron and place on a wire rack.
- 7. Repeat until the mixture is used up.
- 8. Combine the lettuce with the ranch dressing and divide evenly onto plates. Top with each plate with an equal number of tuna waffles.
