#### **III** Baked Boneless Chicken Thighs

Prep Time: 10 min. Cook Time: 30 min. Total time: 40 min. Serves 6

#### **III** Ingredients:

- 2 pounds boneless skinless chicken thighs
- 2 Tablespoons olive oil
- 1 tsp. Kosher salt, or 1/2 tsp. tsp. other salt
- 1/4 tsp. black pepper
- 1 tsp. garlic powder
- 1 tsp. onion powder
  - 1 tsp. paprika (or smoked paprika)
  - 1/2 tsp. ground cumin
  - 1/4 tsp. cayenne pepper (Or just use chili powder)

#### Directions:

- 1) Preheat oven to 400. Place the thighs in a large bowl.
- 2) Add olive oil and spices. Use your hands to coat the chicken pieces.
- 3) Arrange the seasoned thighs in a single layer on a rimmed baking dish, such as a 9x13 baking dish. Brush on extra oil and spices left in the bowl.
- 4) Bake until the thighs are cooked through, juices run clear, and a meat thermometer reads 165,
  - 5) Serve immediately.

III Karla cooks two 2 or 3 thighs at a time; She just sprinkles the spices on instead of measuring as much as what is in the recipe for a serving of 6. This is so good!!





From Your Favorite Pastor

Ahhh, Valentine's Day! Hallmark's favorite day of the year. Florists love it too. The entire day is to be dedicated to love and the most significant ones that we love in our lives, our spouses/significant other. When we look at the word love, we see that it has different connotations in the English language with romantic love, parental love, sibling love, friend love, and others. Each one of those is a different kind of love. We see the same thing in the Bible when we look at love.

So I decided to do a quick word study of love in the Bible to see what we get. Oh boy! There are 458 times in the Old Testament and 286 in the New Testament (ESV, different in the various translations due to interpretation) where the word "love" is used. Of those, the Old Testament (Hebrew) uses 8 different connotations and the New Testament (Greek) uses 9 different ones. In the Hebrew, the two most often used are romantic love and loyalty/faithfulness. In the NT is where we see Jesus do what He always does, change our perspective.

The 2 most common uses of love in the NT Greek are agape and agapao, which are both different than the other main one used: phileo, which represents tender affection. The first one, agape, is not a romantic love as we would think of it. It is a noun that was used by the NT authors to express the distinctive character of Christian love, which included God's love to man, man's love to God, and man's love to fellow man (John 3:16; 1 Corinthians 2:9; 1 John 4:8; Romans 8:28; 1 Corinthians 8:3; John 15:13; Galatians 5:14; Romans 13:8). We see the pinnacle of this love in 1 Corinthians 13 and 1 John 4 where the love of Christ is best exemplified for us to follow. The second, agapao, the largest connotation that is used means to care and is a verb. This is the one that is an action for us to fulfill as believers and followers of Jesus the Christ. This is the one where many Christians struggle because it often calls for rather significant sacrifices on our part. Those sacrifices can range quite a bit in terms of what God is asking, from uprooting our lives to move to another country to walking next door to help unload groceries.

Here's the bigger lesson I take away: these 2 meanings combine to work together to fulfill what we are called to do. We've discussed it here before, as well as in messages and letters, that we are to love God with all our being, love our neighbors as are ourselves, and make disciples (followers) of Christ. This is done in both noun (agape) and verb (agapao) working together to complete. This February, as plans are made to celebrate romantic love, lets remember to also agape/agapao fellow believers, neighbors, family, friends, and everyone we come in contact with. It is done by both physical acts of service and verbal acts of sharing the Good News with people we are around. Doing both of those things shows people the greatest love there is, the love of Christ for sinners.

Matthew 3:15-17 *Apologetics Bible pg* 

Members of cults and non-Christian religions take issue with Christian teaching about God's nature, particularly the doctrine of the Trinity. Critics point to this passage as evidence that the New Testament teaches tri-theism (three gods). After all, it is argued there are three distinct divinities referenced here: the Father, whose voice comes out of heaven, the Son, who is being baptized by John the Baptist and the Holy Spirit, who came down upon Jesus as a dove. Therefore, how can Christians speak of God as one when this clearly shows He is three?

The answer is that God is One in essence (Deuteronomy 6:4; Mark 12:29), yet three in Person: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. That is no contradiction, for God is One in one thing (*what* He is – His unified, divine essence) and three in another (*who* He is – three individual Persons making up the Trinity). Each member is distinct from the others, and so they are described as distinct; and yet they share equally and eternally in the divine essence, making them fundamentally unified.

Matthew 7:1 *Apologetics Bible pg* 

In our politically correct age, we are told that it's not our right to point fingers and pass judgment on others.

However, this is actually a judgment in and of itself, and thus it contradicts the principle that we should not judge others. So when someone tells you that it's wrong for you to judge, ask, "So then why are you judging me?" Anyone who says Jesus prohibits all judgment in Matthew 7:1 has taken His words out of context. It is a self-righteous, hypocritical judgment that Jesus condemns (Romans 2:1-3). Elsewhere He actually commands His followers to 'judge according to righteous judgment" (John 7:24). Paul said Christians are responsible for discerning the actions of other Christians (1 Corinthians 5:9-13, 6:2-5). Of course, our goal must be correction rather than scorn when we make righteous judgments. We must keep a humble, non-hypocritical spirit when we judge others, but we should never by into the idea that it is wrong to practice and communicate discernment.



#### Ingredients

4 cups (14.08 oz) fresh cauliflower (8 greens)

2 large eggs (2/3 lean)

2 tablespoons ranch dressing mix (12 condiments)

1 1/3 cup (5.33 oz) cheddar cheese (1 1/3 lean)

5 oz turkey bacon (1 lean)

1 teaspoon chives

#### **Directions**

- 1. Preheat oven to 375°. Pulse cauliflower in a food processor until it forms large crumbs.
- 2. Place cauliflower in paper towels or cheesecloth and wring out any excess water. Pour cauliflower crumbles into a large bowl.
- 3.Add eggs, 1 cup cheese, ranch seasoning, about 3/4s of the bacon, and chives.
- 4. Grease a muffin tin with cooking spray, then fill each one about 2/3s full. Top with a sprinkle of cheese and crumbled bacon. Bake for about 20 to 22 minutes, or until lightly golden. Garnish with additional chives before serving.

#### Ingredients:

14 oz – Chicken Breast ~Yields 9 oz cooked (1 1/2 leaner)

1/2 cup (2 oz) grated - 2% Reduced Fat Cheese (1/2 lean)

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup – Franks Hot Wing Sauce (4 condiments)

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup – Light Ranch Dressing (2 healthy fats)

2 tbsp – Reduced Fat Cream Cheese (2 condiments)

1 ½ cups (5.34 oz) – Celery cut into sticks (3 greens)

1 ½ cups (7.89 oz) – Sliced Bell Peppers (3 greens)

#### Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
