From Your Favorite Pastor

There is a story of a teacher that talked on the four seasons, telling how in the spring the new life comes to the earth, with the growth of grasses and leaves and flowers, how this life matures in summer, and so on, and so on. Then she called on the class to repeat the information she had given. She asked one little boy about spring. "What do we find in the spring, George?" George seemed very reluctant to answer, but when the teacher insisted he at last said: "Why, ma'am, there's a frog, an' a lizard, an' a snake, an' a dead cat, but I didn't put the cat there. It was another boy." We find a lot of new things when spring comes, including some messes we don't want to clean up!

As we are called to be a follower and disciple of Christ, something similar happens in us. The yuck and dirt of our lives gets exposed to us by the Spirit. Paul tells us how we all have this in Romans 3:23 "For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard." We all fall short all the time, and there is no way we can make ourselves right with God without Christ. When we begin to follow Christ, we also start the discipleship process which starts us out on a new journey. That journey is to work toward a life of maturity in Christ, which we are told to work toward in several places including I Cor. 13, Romans 11, I Peter 2, and Ephesians 1. For most of us in this process, it starts to reveal the dirt and yuck in our heart. This happens because as we move to more knowledge and understanding, the Spirit reveals things we didn't know of.

As the Spirit reveals these things, He starts to clean them out as well. Each step in the cleaning process brings us closer to the blossom that God desires from us. A blossoming of our faith which leads to others seeing Christ shine through us. So be encouraged this spring to seek a growing maturity in Christ so that you can be a fully bloomed follower of Him that is seen by all the world. Read the passages listed above, have a great Easter and have a great spring!

Twisted Scripture



Matthew 14:6-12

This passage leads Jehovah's Witnesses and some Christian holiness groups to believe it is wrong to celebrate birthdays or holidays. Are birthday celebrations pagan simply because Herod killed John the Baptist at such an event? The only way to draw this conclusion from Matthew 14:6-12 is to read it into the text. The most we can say from this passage is that it's unwise to make rash promises when caught up in the emotion of a celebration event, as happened to Herod (vv. 7,9). Nothing in the context says birthday celebrations are wrong. The same is true of secular holidays. In 1 Corinthians 8, Paul went so far as to say that eating meat offered to idols was not immoral as long as choosing to do so did not cause another Christian to stumble. Using this as a general principle, we see that the Bible allows Christians the freedom to participate in such events as birthday parties and holiday festivities as long as no harm is done to others (Colossians 2:16).

Matthew 18:19-20

Some Christians take this verse to mean that the Spirit of Jesus comes around only if two or three Christians are gathered together. However, context indicates that this is a mistaken conclusion. The topic of Matthew 18 is church discipline, where an errant Christian Is confronted about his or her ongoing sin. Jesus promised in verse 17 that He would be present whenever the church leaders met together to resolve difficult situations such as these (also see 1 Corinthians 5:4). Later, Jesus told His disciples that He would be with them always, even to the end of the age (Matthew 28:19-20). He did not say it would take two or more of them to make this a reality. If Matthew 18:19-20 really did say that two or three believers are needed for Christ to be present, by implication we should never read our Bibles alone or pray by ourselves. Yet Jesus emphasized the importance of privately coming to God (Matthew 6:6), and so we know He is present with us even when we are alone.

- 10. This was where Jesus and His followers were when He ascended to heaven.





Cauliflower Pepperoni Pizza Casserole

Makes 4 servings
Per serving:
3 vegetables
1.5 ounces protein
3/4 fat serving
1.5 condiments

Ingredients:

1 large cauliflower, cut into florets – use 4 cups of florets

1 tbsp olive oil

2 cups low sodium canned diced tomatoes – pizza sauce is too high in carbohydrates

2 oz turkey pepperoni

1/4 cup black olives, sliced

1 cup mozzarella, shredded

1/4 cup parmigiano Reggiano (parmesan), grated 1/4 tsp oregano (optional)

Directions

- 1. Toss the cauliflower in the oil, place on a baking sheet in a single layer, and roast in a preheated 400F/200C oven until it starts to caramelize, about 20-30 minutes, mixing halfway through.
- 2. Mix the cauliflower, tomatoes, pepperoni, and olives, reserving some pepperoni and olives; place in a baking dish, sprinkle on the cheese followed by the reserved toppings and the oregano.
- 3. Bake in a preheated 350F/180C oven until the cheese has melted and the sides are bubbling- about 20 minutes.



Cloud Bread Egg Salad Sandwich

1 lean - 3 Green - 0 Healthy fat - 3 Condiment (Per serving) 4 servings

• 1 Tbsp Dijon mustard

• ½ tsp paprika

• ½ tsp pepper

•• 2 cups arugula

• 2 sliced tomatoes

• ½ tsp salt

Ingredients:

- 3 eggs, whites and yolks, carefully separated
- 3 Tbsp low-fat, herb- and garlic
- -flavored cream cheese
- 1 packet calorie-free sweetener
- ½ tsp cream of tartar
- Cooking spray
- 8 hard-boiled eggs, chopped
- ²/₃ cup plain, low-fat Greek yogurt
- ½ cup chopped celery
- ½ cup chopped scallions
- ½ cup chopped green pepper
- 1/4 cup chopped jalapeno pepper

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 300°F.
- 2. In a small bowl, mix egg yolks, cream cheese, and sugar substitute until well combined.
- 3. In a large bowl, combine egg whites and cream of tartar, and beat on high speed until egg whites form stiff peaks. You'll know you have stiff peaks when the egg whites are shiny and stand straight up when the beaters are lifted.
- 4. Very carefully fold the egg yolk mixture into egg whites until combined. Be very careful not to break the egg whites.
- 5. Scoop mixture into eight even rounds on a lightly greased baking sheet.
- 6. Bake for approximately 25 to 30 minutes, until tops are golden brown. Allow to cool completely on a rack when finished.
- 7. Meanwhile, prepare the egg salad. Combine the chopped, hardboiled eggs, yogurt, celery, scallions, green pepper, jalapeno pepper, Dijon mustard, paprika, salt, and pepper in a medium-sized bowl, and mash with a fork
- 8. Prepare sandwiches by topping four cloud bread halves with an equal amount of tomato slices, arugula, egg salad mixture, and remaining cloud bread halves.
