From your favorite Pastor!

Here we are with the season of Lent kicking in, and all that it leads up to. Millions of people use this time to "give something up," usually involving some sort of food or drink that they really like. Many years ago I gave up pop for Lent and haven't really turned back to it since, but that time also got me truly thinking about what Lent is and why we do it. Many use Lent to give something up for a health or diet plan and not really anything about their walk with Christ. So being Americans, we use the day before Lent to binge on all those things that we are going to be going without over the next several weeks and we totally miss the point. But have YOU ever really thought about what Lent really is and why it may be something to do?

Lent isn't actually a Biblical thing, in that we don't see it written as something we are to observe. It developed over the years of the early church into what Catholics and many mainline Protestant churches observe today. I found this good description of what it is to accomplish for us if we decide to observe it. "Although its format has varied throughout the centuries and throughout different cultures, the basic concept remains the same: to open our hearts to God's refining grace through prayer, confession, fasting, and almsgiving as we anticipate Holy Week. Lent traditionally lasts forty days, modeled after Christ's forty day fast in the desert, and ends on Good Friday. In the Western Church, Lent officially begins with a reminder of our mortality on Ash Wednesday."

Even though it isn't something specifically mentioned in Scriptures, it has many components that are. I highly recommend to people to observe it, but to do it by tying Scriptures to it and prayer that involves asking God to work in us to bring us closer to Him as we prepare to celebrate the great sacrifice and victory that is Easter. Here are some Scriptures you can incorporate into your daily studies during the next 40 days; Joel 2:12-14, Matthew 6:16-18, Philippians 3:10-11, I Peter 5:6, Mark 1:12-15, Isaiah 58:6-7, Mark 9:2-10, Luke 13:3, Ezekiel 18:21, John 17:17, John 12, Psalm 91.

May God use the next few weeks to bring you closer to Him each and every day. That you will know the grace that we get through what He did on that hill and cross, and the victory we receive because that stone rolled away. "For this is how God loved the world: He gave His one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16, NLT)

Twisted Scripture

John 9:2 "His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" Pg 1132 Apologetics Bible

The Eastern idea of reincarnation teaches that after we die, we are destined to return as someone else in another life. Followers of Hinduism and Buddhism believe that how you live now (called "karma, "which can be made of either good or bad things) determines whether your next life will be pleasant or miserable. Taken out of context, one might use John 9:2 to argue that the disciples believed in reincarnation, yet Jesus answered their question in a way that proves the impossibility of someone sinning before birth, and hence the impossibility of karma and reincarnation. He said the man was born with an affliction not because he sinned in a past life, but "so that God's works might be displayed in him" (vs. 3). Hebrews 9:27 further supports the impossibility of karma and reincarnation when it says, "it is appointed for people to dies once" before the judgment comes. That is why 'now is the day of salvation' (2 Corinthians 6:2). Resurrection, not reincarnation, is what awaits us after death.

John 3:5 Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless

they are born of water and the Spirit."' Pg. 1122 Apologetics Bible

This verse is often used to justify the mistaken belief that water baptism is required for salvation. There are several problems with this interpretation. First, Jesus elsewhere said that He came to 'seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:10). Since the New Testament never says Jesus baptized anyone, it seems obvious that baptism is unnecessary for salvation. Second, rather than baptizing, Jesus went around teaching everyone who He was and telling them that it was necessary to believe in Him. In His own words, "God loved the world in this way: He gave His one and Only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish but have eternal live" (John 3:16). Furthermore, He made it clear that condemnation is based not on failure to be baptized, but on failure to believe in Him (John 3:16). Finally, if baptism is a requirement for justification before God, it would conflict with the biblical teaching that salvation comes by faith alone (Galatians 2:16; Ephesians 2:8-9)

Luke 23:44-46

It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. Jesus called out with a loud voice, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." When he had said this, he breathed his last.'

Some critics claim that Jesus merely fainted during His crucifixion, and was mistaken for dead, and was then hauled down and buried alive. Further, they say that He escaped the tomb and appeared to His disciples, who mistakenly believed that He was resurrected. However, there are sure signs that Jesus actually died. The Roman soldiers usually broke the legs of the crucifixion victims to speed up their deaths. When they set out to break Jesus' legs, they discovered that He was already dead (John 19:33). To prove this to themselves, the soldiers pierced Jesus' heart through His side (John 19:34). This would have killed Him if He wasn't already dead. In addition, blood loss due to His flogging and the piercing of His hands and feet (which would have severed arteries and nerves) made death inevitable. Also, the skeptic must explain how it's possible that a badly wounded Jesus could escape a closed tomb, sneak past Roman guards, and go on to convince His *followers that He had conquered death.*

Buffalo Bites

Ingredients:

1 1/4 pound

to 97% lean) chicken or turkey

2 oz cream cheese, softened

4 egg whites

2 TBL chopped celery

(You can easily double this recipe if you have a bigger crowd than 3)

Instructions:


Combine all of the meatball ingredients in a medium bowl. Form into about 1-inch balls. (I use a 1inch cookie scooper~ this makes perfect uniform bites and keeps your hands mess-free)

Place them on a greased cookie sheet (with sides) and bake at 350 degrees (F) for 10 minutes.

After 10 minutes, remove the meatballs from the oven and pour 1 TBL Franks wing sauce (or your favorite sugar-free sauce) on each one. Put them back in the oven and bake for another 12 minutes.

Serve with celery.

Makes 3 servings (about 8 meatballs per serving if using 1 inch scoop) Enjoy!

8 oz light cream cheese, softened

1 c fat free Greek yogurt

8 oz cooked, lean ground turkey

) deg 1 c of favorite salsa

sauce

1 Tbs taco seasoning

1 c shredded lettuce

1 c shredded cheddar cheese

1 c tomato, diced

1 small avocado, diced

½ c onions, sliced

1 Tbs sliced olives

1 lbs mini bell peppers, sliced in half lengthwise, stems and seeds removed, for serving instead of chips

Directions

- 1. Combine softened cream cheese, Greek yogurt, ground turkey, salsa and taco seasoning until smooth and well combined.
- 2. Spread into a rectangle baking dish or pie plate (I used an 11"x7" baking pan) 3.Refrigerate for an hour to let flavors combine (optional). Top with remaining ingredients.
