From Your Favorite Pastor



The 5th New York Volunteer Infantry, "Duryée's Zouaves," was one of the most renowned fighting regiments of the American Civil War. Their colorful Zouave uniform, precise maneuvers, effectiveness in combat and steady bearing under fire, won them universal respect and recognition. "I doubt whether it had an equal," General George Sykes said of the 5th New York.

On the afternoon of August 30, 1862, the third day of the Second Battle of Manassas, John Bell Hood's famed "Texas Brigade" launched a massive attack. There were few Union troops to meet the onslaught, among those, were two Zouave regiments: the 5th and 10th New York. In less than 10 minutes, 85 lives of approximately 525 men of the 5th New York were lost.

Brevet Brigadier General Hiram Duryea, former commander of the 5th New York, would later comment on that fateful day in a Memorial Day tribute at Manassas in 1907, on land he had purchased for the erection of a monument to his beloved Zouaves: "We stand on holy ground! For this field was the altar of God. The Master said, 'Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends.' Here, our comrades laid down their lives for love of country, for human right, for the love and service of man. We sorrow at their loss, but we rejoice at their glorious death and achievements. God grant that the fruits of their sacrifice be preserved to our country."

As we approach Memorial Day, we remember and celebrate the sacrifice of the over 1.3 million deaths and over 38,000 missing soldiers that have served to protect this nation. That sacrifice gave us the freedom to worship God in this amazing country, and we are to honor that sacrifice.

We honor that as believers in Christ by doing what Jesus called us to. Brigadier General Duryea quoted John 15:13 above. But when we look at the context of that passage in v.9-17, we see that Jesus was calling us to something specific with that. First, He tells us that we are His friends when we follow Him and do what He calls us to. As friends, He gave the ultimate sacrifice for us by dying on the cross. (v.13-14) Then in v.16 He goes on to tell us how we honor that sacrifice, "...go and produce lasting fruit..." That fruit is sharing the message of hope that only Jesus gives, the hope of salvation through Him alone. Jesus finishes the passage with the command that will help us accomplish that: "love each other." (v.17) Love people sacrificially through serving them, helping them, giving generously, and standing by them through the trials of life.

This Memorial Day pray for the families of those who have given the ultimate sacrifice, pray for the salvation of all those serving now, and go love others to Christ-fulfilling His command. Read John 15:1-17 this month, and pray about what He says to you there.

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Twisted Scripture

Matthew 14:6-12

This passage leads Jehovah's Witnesses and some Christian holiness groups to believe it is wrong to celebrate birthdays or holidays. Are birthday celebrations pagan simply because Herod killed John the Baptist at such an event? The only way to draw this conclusion from Matthew 14:6-12 is to read it into the text. The most we can say from this passage is that it's unwise to make rash promises when caught up in the emotion of a celebration event, as happened to Herod (vs. 7,9). Nothing in the context says birthday celebrations are wrong. The same is true of secular holidays. In 1 Corinthians 8, Paul went so far as to say that eating meat offered to idols was not immoral as long as choosing to do so did not cause another Christian to stumble. Using this as a general principle, we see that the Bible allows Christians the freedom to participate in such events as birthday parties and holiday festivities as long as no harm is done to others (Colossians 2:16).

Matthew 18:19-20

Some Christians take this verse to mean that the Spirit of Jesus comes around only if two or three Christians are gathered together. However, context indicates that this is a mistaken conclusion. The topic of Matthew 18 is church discipline, where an errant Christian Is confronted about his or her ongoing sin. Jesus promised in verse 17 that He would be present whenever the church leaders met together to resolve difficult situations such as these (also see 1 Corinthians 5:4). Later, Jesus told His disciples that He would be with them always, even to the end of the age (Matthew 28:19-20). He did not say it would take two or more of them to make this a reality. If Matthew 18:19-20 really did say that two or three believers are needed for Christ to be present, by implication we should never read our Bibles alone or pray by ourselves. Yet Jesus emphasized the importance of privately coming to God (Matthew 6:6), and so we know He is present with us even when we are alone.




I'VE JUST SEEN JESUS: POST-RESURRECTION APPEARANCES

About Lexi—"The work ethic she has shown while serving on our Seasonal Staff is exemplary, and her willingness to do what needs to be done is great. Whether she is preparing the place for our guests through cleaning and maintenance or actively hosting guests by running an activity during a weekend retreat, she will be contributing to making this ministry possible. She will be a valuable addition to our resident staff."

"Although Barakel provides for several physical needs for our resident missionary staff families, we do not pay wages. None of our campers' fees go toward a payroll, which makes camp affordable for more families. Camp does provide housing and utilities, so our Board of Trustees has determined that if Lexi raises \$1200 per month, and this is added to Isaac's support, they will be fully financially supported."


Food Pantry News

Thank you for your support for the Bancroft Food Pantry! Thank you for all the workers who come and help distribute food.

Last month we helped over 34 families. We usually go through about 1000 pounds of food a month.

We're very fortunate to have the Lansing Food Bank support for our pantry. We are very excited that the Food Bank helped us out in April and gave us a grant for \$750! It's for infrastructure improvements; from their infrastructure program. It's only to be used for 'Infrastructure improvements' necessary for the effective distribution of foods. It's not to buy our food, but to help with our distribution. Some ideas that we have already come up with are some new carts and or a dolly; which will help us move the food around. Food is heavy to move around. It will be a big help. We need to spend it by June 13th. This was exciting news for our pantry team!





Loaded Cauliflower "Mash" Bake

YIELD: 4 servings

PER SERVING: 3/4 oz lean, 3 greens, 3 condiments, 1/4 healthy fat

INGREDIENTS:

4 slices Jennie-O Extra Lean Turkey bacon 6 cups cauliflower florets 3 cloves crushed garlic 1/3 cup 1% buttermilk 1 tbsp whipped butter

1/2 tsp black pepper 2 tbsp minced fresh chives,

3/4 tsp salt

¼ cup shredded reduced-fat cheddar cheese

DIRECTIONS:

set aside on a paper towel then crumble. Fill a large pot with water, bring to a boil and add cauliflower and garlic. Boil until the cauliflower is soft, about 15-20 minutes. Drain, and return to the pot. Preheat the oven to 350°F. Add the buttermilk, butter, salt, and pepper to the cauliflower and purée with a hand blender. If you don't own a hand blender, a regular blender would work fine as well. Mix in 1 Tosp of the chives and transfer to 4 individual casseroles (3/4 cups each) or one 8 x 8 casserole dish and top with cheddar and crumbled bacon. Bake in the oven until the cheese melts, about 5 minutes then top with remaining chives.

Cook the turkey bacon in a skillet until crisp;



Healthy Chicken Parmesan

YIELD: 3 Serving

PER SERVING: 1 Leaner, 1 Green, 1 Healthy Fat & 3 Condiments

INGREDIENTS:

2 tsp olive oil

1 tsp chopped thyme

1 tsp chopped rosemary

1 tsp chopped Italian parsley

3 chicken cutlets (about 4 ounces

cooked each)

1/4 tsp salt 1/2 tsp pepper

1/4 cup Rao's marinara sauce

1 cup shredded part-skim

mozzarella

8 tsp grated reduced-fat parmesan

1/2 Tosp unsalted butter, cut into pieces.

DIRECTIONS:

Preheat oven to 500°F.

In a bowl, stir oil, thyme, rosemary, and parsley. Brush both sides of chicken w/herb oil and sprinkle w/salt and pepper.

Heat a large, heavy ovenproof skillet over high heat. Add chicken cook just until browned, 1 minute per side. Remove from the heat.

Spoon marinara sauce over and around the cutlets. Sprinkle w/mozzarella, 2.6 tsp of Parmesan. Dot tops w/butter pieces bake until cheese melts and chicken is cooked 5 minutes.
