From Your Favorite Pastor

Early in the morning on June 6, 1944, nearly 7,000 landing craft loaded with almost 160,000 troops appeared along the Normandy coast. This was Operation Overlord, the start of the battle to take back Europe from evil. It was a costly day, and a very costly next 10 months. But the war was won and people were freed from fascism and evil, and the world was saved. We just celebrated the 81st anniversary of that date, remembering those young men who stepped off those landing craft even as they faced almost certain death. Since the Revolutionary War, our country has had almost 670,000 combat deaths with an additional 670,000+ deaths related to those conflicts. Men and women willing to sacrifice for their brothers and their country. On July 4 we celebrate the birth of our nation, but I think we really celebrate the freedoms that we attained through the Revolution. Those freedoms exist today because of the sacrifices of over 1.3 million people. We experience another freedom in our life, a freedom that exceeds any government or personal situation we may face because of one incredible God.

We experience that freedom when we come to Christ. Christ moves into our lives and starts the sanctification process, working to make us more like Him. I Corinthians 3:16-18 says, "But whenever someone turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away. For the Lord is the Spirit, and wherever the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. So, all of us who have had that veil removed can see and reflect the glory of the Lord. And the Lord- who is the Spirit- makes us more and more like Him as we are changed into His glorious image." The freedom we experience in Christ becomes a lifelong quest to be more like Him, to shine that freedom to the world around us just as our country shines freedom to the world. Let's remember this summer that there is a freedom Christ offers that is even greater than the freedom we experience in this great country!








THE ARK OF THE COVENANT






Camp Barakel Board Official Statement June 9, 2025

In 1942, Holman "Johnnie" Johnson organized a summer camp we now know as Camp Barakel. The name is Hebrew for "blessing of God" and was suggested by a nine-year-old camper. For the past 83 years, thousands have come to discover that Camp Barakel is truly a place God has blessed.

The Camp Barakel Board of Trustees understands that with great blessing comes great responsibility. Over the last couple of decades, we have endeavored to care for the Resident Missionary Staff (RMS) of Camp Barakel by assessing their well-being and offering guidance and encouragement. In the last two or three years, through our interactions with the RMS we decided to do a health assessment of Camp Barakel.

This assessment reveals we have much to praise God for, especially regarding the proclamation of the gospel! Chapel services are filled with doctrinally rich singing and Bible-based preaching. The Lord continues to bless Barakel with strong numbers of campers, retreaters and volunteers alike. We are so thankful Barakel continues to be a place God is blessing.

Our health assessment did raise some areas of concern. There is overwhelming pressure on our RMS which has resulted in problems like overwork, low morale, conflicts, and communication issues. Many of our RMS are struggling. Some have left over the last few years. Others are considering leaving.

The Barakel Board of Trustees has high respect and deep love for our RMS. This has happened on our watch, and we are deeply grieved. We believe the internal state of Camp Barakel has reached a critical point. We **LOVE** our RMS and are committed to taking meaningful steps to ensure we do not neglect the very people who carry what is most precious to God: The Gospel, the magnification of Jesus, and the joy of His people through this ministry.


We confess that we have not served them well by allowing things to reach this point. With sincere hearts, we have asked for their forgiveness.

On June 3rd, the Barakel Board met and voted to take the following action steps:

- 1. Several years ago, the board began to develop a succession plan at Paul Gardner's request. Paul is encouraging the board to accelerate this process as he continues in his current role. Therefore, we are no longer looking to appoint an Assistant Director who will become Director in the future. Our new goal is to search for a Director.
- 2. After this 2025 summer season and Labor Day Family Camp, Barakel will take a unique type of sabbatical we are calling: gospel sabbatical. In order to accomplish this, we will suspend all new registrations starting after the summer season and Labor Day family camp.
- 3. 2025 summer camps will proceed as scheduled. We are confident, with the summer staff at the highest numbers we've seen since before COVID, that the scheduled Gospel proclamation ministry for the summer will be done well to God's glory.

We recognize the magnitude of these announcements as well as the concerns that may be raised. It might help to know this decision was not made lightly, but only after much prayer, consultation and deliberation. For those of you who love Camp Barakel, our hope is that you will continue to pray for and support the camp and our RMS during this season of restoration and hope. When we re-open, please join us again!





Ingredients

- 1½ lbs. boneless, skinless chicken breasts
- ☐ ¼ tsp each (or less) salt & pepper
- 1 cup riced or cubed kabocha squash
- ☐ 1 cup riced zucchini
- ☐ 1 cup riced yellow summer squash
- ☐ 1 cup riced broccoli
- ☐ 8 cherry tomatoes, halved
- 4 radishes, sliced thin
- ☐ 1 cup shredded red cabbage
- ☐ ¼ cup hemp or pumpkin seeds

Green Goddess Dressing

- ☐ ½ cup low-fat plain Greek yogurt
- ☐ 1 cup fresh basil
- ☐ 1 clove garlic
- ☐ 4 tbsp lemon juice
- ☐ ¼ tsp each (or less) salt & pepper

Directions

- Preheat grill or oven to 350°F.
- 2. Season chicken with salt and pepper.
- Grill or roast chicken about 10-12 minutes until it reaches an internal temperature of 165°F. When done, remove from oven and set aside to rest, about 5 minutes. Cut into bite-sized pieces and keep warm.
- While chicken rests, steam riced kabocha squash, zucchini, yellow summer squash, and broccoli in a covered microwave proof bowl about 5 minutes until tender
- For the dressing, combine all of the ingredients in a blender and puree until smooth.
- 6. To serve, place an equal amount of the riced veggle mixture into four individual serving bowls. Add an equal amount of cherry tomatoes, radishes, and shredded cabbage to each bowl along with a quarter of the chicken and one tablespoon of seeds. Drizzle dressing on top, and serve.

INSTANT POT CHIPOTLE CHICKEN & CAULIFLOWER RICE BOWLS

YIELD: 4 SERVINGS

PER SERVING: 1 LEANER | 1 HEALTHY FAT | 3 GREEN | 3 CONDIMENTS


TOTAL TIME: 30 MINUTES

INGREDIENTS:

- 1, 14.5-oz. can fire-roasted diced tomatoes
- □ 1/3 cup salsa
- 1 canned chipotle pepper in adobo sauce + 1 tsp sauce
- ☐ 1 tsp cumin
- ☐ ½ tsp dried oregano ☐ ¼ tsp salt
- ☐ 1½ lbs boneless skinless
- chicken breasts
 4 cups frozen riced
 cauliflower
- 1 cup reduced-fat shredded Mexican cheese blend
- ☐ ½ medium-sized

DIRECTIONS:

- Combine first six ingredients in a blender, and blend until smooth.
- Place chicken in Instant Pot, and pour sauce over top. Secure lid and close pressure valve. Set to 20 minutes at high pressure. Allow pressure to release naturally before opening. Remove chicken and shred, and then toss back in sauce.
- Meanwhile, microwave riced cauliflower according to package directions.
- To serve: Divide riced cauliflower, chicken, cheese, and avocado evenly amongst four bowls.


