Twisted Scripture



John 9:2

The Eastern idea of reincarnation teaches that after we die, we are destined to return as someone else in another life. Followers of Hinduism and Buddhism believe that how you live now (called "karma, "which can be made of of either good or bad things) determines whether your next life will be pleasant of miserable. Taken out of context, one might use John 9:2 to argue that the disciples believed in reincarnation, yet Jesus answered their question in a way that proves the impossibility of someone sinning before birth, and hence the impossibility of karma and reincarnation. He said the man was born with an affliction not because he sinned in a past life, but "so that God's works might be displayed in him" (vs. 3). Hebrews 9:27 further supports the impossibility of karma and reincarnation when it says, "it is appointed for people to dies once" before the judgment comes. That is why 'now is the day of salvation' (2 Corinthians 6:2). Resurrection, not reincarnation, is what awaits us after death.

John 3:5

'Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit."'

This verse is often used to justify the mistaken belief that water baptism is required for salvation. There are several problems with this interpretation. First, Jesus elsewhere said that He came to 'seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:10). Since the New Testament never says Jesus baptized anyone, it seems obvious that baptism is unnecessary for salvation. Second, rather than baptizing, Jesus went around teaching everyone who He was and telling them that it was necessary to believe in Him. In His own words, "God loved the world in this way: He gave His one and Only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish but have eternal live" (John 3:16). Furthermore, He made it clear that condemnation is based not on failure to be baptized, but on failure to believe in Him (John 3:16). Finally, if baptism is a requirement for justification before God, it would conflict with the biblical teaching that salvation comes by faith alone (Galatians 2:16; Ephesians 2:8-9)

Luke 23:44-46

'It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. Jesus called out with a loud voice, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." When he had said this, he breathed his last.'

Some critics claim that Jesus merely fainted during His crucifixion, and was mistaken for dead, and was then hauled down and buried alive. Further, they say that He escaped the tomb and appeared to His disciples, who mistakenly believed that He was resurrected. However, there are sure signs that Jesus actually died. The Roman soldiers usually broke the legs of the crucifixion victims to speed up their deaths. When they set out to break Jesus' legs, they discovered that He was already dead (John 19:33). To prove this to themselves, the soldiers pierced Jesus' heart through His side (John 19:34). This would have killed Him if He wasn't already dead. In addition, blood loss due to His flogging and the piercing of His hands and feet (which would have severed arteries and nerves) made death inevitable. Also, the skeptic must explain how it's possible that a badly wounded Jesus could escape a closed tomb, sneak past Roman guards, and go on to convince His followers that He had conquered death.



This year we're asking you to pack a complete box that we can send. We have a few items to share that you can pick up to add to your box, if you'd like. See Karla Reed if you would like to look at some of our left over items you might be able to use to add to your box!

You can pick up a shoebox to pack.

First select an age group 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14. Chose to fill a girl or a boy box. Then fill your box with at least one or more of the following! (List not limited to items listed below. As long as its not on the do not add list.)

The boxes need at least one or more of each of the following items:

1- Wow item— For girls it can be a stuffie, a doll, or large toy, a soccer ball, a musical instrument (Not limited to these ideas)



For boys— A stuffie, a soccer ball (Deflated supplied with a needle and pump to reinflate), a large toy, a nice toy truck or car

2- Personal care item– (We like to include at least 2 or 3 items- Both boys or girls-

Toothbrush, washcloth, comb or brush, nail clipper or file for older kids, water bottle, flashlight

3– School supplies— Both boys and girls– Pencils, sharpener, and eras ers, pencil container, pens,

crayons, markers, notebook, index cards, calculator, scissors, ruler, glue stick, small adhesive tape, drawstring bag.



4– Clothing and accessories- Boys and girls- Flip flop or shoes, sunglasses, hat, wristwatch, clothing or undergarments, winter cap, gloves, or mittens



5– Games and Activities– Boys and girls- Puzzles, coloring books, or pads, dry water color set, binoculars or compass, musical instruments, chalkboard and chalk, jump rope, stickers, games



6– Toys– Boys and girls- Small ball, building blocks or lego sets, slinky or yoyo, toy cars, plastic animals, magnets, interactive toys, other small toys.

DO NOT INCLUDE: Soap, food, candy, gum, toothpaste, USED or DAMAGED items, scary or war related items, wearable traditional camouflage, seeds or organic matter,

liquids, medication, money, breakable items, matches, fire starters, areoles, knives, saws, or razor blades.

Spaghetti Squash Carbonara

YIELD: 8 Serving

PER SERVING: 1 Green, 1/4 ounce Protein, 3 Condiments

INGREDIENTS:

2 top sait

1 ¼ tsp fresh cracked black peoper

4 cups cooked spaghetti squash

4 slices Jennie-O Extra Lean

Turkey Bacon

2 tsp minoed gartic

% cup low-sodium chicken broth

2 egg yolks

1 whole egg

15 cup grated Parmesan Cheese

DIRECTIONS:

Preheat the oven to 375.

Prepare spaghetti squash by oven or microwave. Scrap meat out wflork. In a large saute part, over medium heat, cook bacon until crispy. Add garlic, saute 1 minute. Add broth and cook until the liquid has completely evaporated.

In a bowl, whisk eggs, cheese, sait and pepper. Combine the eggs with acon, warming the eggs in the pan. (Do not let the eggs cook through.) Mix in squash cook until squash is heated through.



Pizza Soup for a cold winter day!

Ingredients:

1 Tbls. Butter

1 lb. Extra-lean ground Chicken Italian Sausage

2 Cloves minced Garlic

½ Cup chopped Green Onion

1 Cup Bell Pepper, cut into ½ to 1-inch chunks

1 Cup Mushrooms, quartered

2 Cups Chicken or Vegetable Broth

28 oz. can (3 ½ Cups) crushed Tomatoes

1 tsp. Italian Seasoning

½ tsp. Salt

½ tsp. Pepper

2.8 oz. Turkey Pepperoni slices, cut into quarters

20 Small Black Olives, sliced

1 1/3 Cups shredded reduced-fat part-skim mozzarella cheese

Directions:

In a nonstick frying pan, melt ½ Tbls. butter and scramble the chicken sausage until cooked through. Set aside.

In a large saucepan or pot, melt the remaining ½ Tbls. butter, sauté garlic, green onion, bell pepper, and mushrooms until tender.

Add broth, tomatoes, and seasonings. Stir to combine and bring just to boiling.

Reduce heat to simmer.

Add cooked sausage, pepperoni, and olives.

Stir and simmer for about 5 more minutes, until heated through, vegetables are soft, and flavors are combined.

Ladle soup into 4 bowls (about 1 ½ cups of soup per serving). Top each with ⅓ Cup Mozzarella Cheese and serve.

Makes 4 Servings

Each serving provides a full Lean and Green meal with required healthy fats and 1 % condiments.
