From Your Favorite Pastor



As I write this there is Christmas music playing on my computer. While I am not one who starts counting down to Christmas on December 26, I do enjoy the music and the season. But for many, Christmas is a depressing time. An article written by a director of the California Department of Mental Hygiene (that title is not a typo :0) warned: "The Christmas season is marked by greater emotional stress and more acts of violence than any other time of the year." The reason for and the result of this is seen in people's actions. Christmas is seen as an excuse to get drunk, have a party, get something, give a little, leave work, get out of school, spend money, overeat, and all kinds of excess (\$950 billion is spent on Christmas in the US annually!). We see the root of sin bare out in people's actions- selfishness.

But for those who truly follow Christ, it is an excuse to exalt Jesus everywhere. It is an opportunity to share with others what Christmas is really about. The celebration of the birth of Christ is equally important to Easter and His death and resurrection. If not for Him coming, He could not have died and rose again. We have an opportunity to share that message as more people are willing to be tuned into what we have to tell them.

I believe this year is even more important for the church. We are on the cusp of two possible futures: 1) An outpouring of the Spirit and the Third Great Awakening in our nation, or 2) The collapse of the church and demise of our nation as we know it. I think we could see the first one as God has shaken our foundations in the previous years, giving us a warning shot across the bow that He wants to fill us but that He is also ready to walk away. We are also seeing God do amazing things across college campus' around the country, with kids being baptized in truck beds (even stories of God's mighty movement among that football team down south!).

So my message here? Be ready and willing to share Christ at every opportunity we have so that those around us can make a clear decision for Christ. People are looking for security and peace in a time of upheaval, and Jesus offers that peace for eternity and He uses us to bring that message.

To prepare yourself to share Christ, read the first 2 chapters of each Gospel. This will not only refresh the Christmas story for you, but it will also give you more knowledge of the Gospel of salvation through faith in Jesus Christ. Hearts are ripe for Him, He just needs us to share with those around us.

"My food," said Jesus, "is to do the will of Him who sent me and to finish His work. Do you not say, 'Four months more and then the harvest'? I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest. Even now the reaper draws his wages, even now he harvests the crop for eternal life, so that the sower and the reaper may be glad together. Thus the saying 'One sows and another reaps' is true. I sent you to reap what you have not worked for. Others have done the hard work, and you have reaped the benefits of their labor." John 4:34-38 NIV

Twisted Scripture



Matthew 3:15-17 Apologetics Bible pg 1005

Members of cults and non-Christian religions take issue with Christian teaching about God's nature, particularly the doctrine of the Trinity. Critics point to this passage as evidence that the New Testament teaches tri-theism (three gods). After all, it is argued there are three distinct divinities referenced here: the Father, whose voice comes out of heaven, the Son, who is being baptized by John the Baptist and the Holy Spirit, who came down upon Jesus as a dove. Therefore, how can Christians speak of God as one when this clearly shows He is three?

The answer is that God is One in essence (Deuteronomy 6:4; Mark 12:29), yet three in Person: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. That is no contradiction, for God is One in one thing (*what* He is – His unified, divine essence) and three in another (*who* He is – three individual Persons making up the Trinity). Each member is distinct from the others, and so they are described as distinct; and yet they share equally and eternally in the divine essence, making them fundamentally unified.

Matthew 7:1 Apologetics Bible pg 1010

In our politically correct age, we are told that it's not our right to point fingers and pass judgment on others. However, this is actually a judgment in and of itself, and thus it contradicts the principle that we should not judge others. So, when someone tells you that it's wrong for you to judge, ask, "So then why are you judging me?" Anyone who says Jesus prohibits all judgment in Matthew 7:1 has taken His words out of context. It is a self-righteous, hypocritical judgment that Jesus condemns (Romans 2:1-3). Elsewhere He actually commands His followers to 'judge according to righteous judgment" (John 7:24). Paul said Christians are responsible for discerning the actions of other Christians (1 Corinthians 5:9-13, 6:2-5). Of course, our goal must be correction rather than scorn when we make righteous judgments. We must keep a humble, non-hypocritical spirit when we judge others, but we should never buy into the idea that it is wrong to practice and communicate discernment.

Salted Caramel Jicama Salad (Fake apple dish)
Serves 4, per serving: 1/4 lean, 1 1/2 greens, ~1.5 condiments, 1 snack


Ingredients:

- •390g raw jicama, peeled and cubed (6 Greens)
- •12 oz 2% plain Fage Greek yogurt (1 Lean)
- •1/2 tsp vanilla extract (1/2 Condiment)
- •1/2 tsp ground cinnamon (1 Condiment)
- •1 packet stevia (1 Condiment)
- •2 tbsp Walden Farms caramel syrup, divided (1 Condiment)
- •1/2 tsp coarse sea salt (2 Condiment)
- •28 walnut halves (4 Snacks)

Directions:

- 1. How to toast walnut halves: Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line a baking sheet with foil for easy clean up. Spread walnut on prepared baking sheet in a single layer. Roast for 5 to 10 minutes. Frequently stir the nuts to ensure even baking. Nuts are done when they appear a shade darker and smell toasted.
- 2. Let them cool and then chop. Set aside.
- 3. Combine chopped jicama, yogurt, vanilla extract, cinnamon, stevia, 1 tbsp caramel syrup and half of the chopped walnuts in a medium bowl. Stir until jicama is evenly coated.
- 4. Pour into a serving dish. Drizzle 1 tbsp caramel syrup on top and then top with the other half of walnuts. Sprinkle sea salt on top.
- 5. Serve immediately





Healthy Chicken Parmesan

YIELD: 3 Serving

PER SERVING: 1 Leaner, 1 Green, 1 Healthy Fat & 3 Condiments

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 tsp olive oil
- 1 tsp chopped thyme
- 1 tsp chopped rosemary
- 1 tsp chopped Italian parsley
- 3 chicken cutlets (about 4 ounces
- cooked each)
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp pepper
- % cup Rao's marinara sauce
- 1 cup shredded part-skim
- mozzarella
- 8 tsp grated reduced-fat parmesan
- 1/3 Tbsp unsalted butter, cut into

DIRECTIONS:

Preheat oven to 500°F.

In a bowl, stir oil, thyme, rosemary, and parsley. Brush both sides of chicken w/herb oil and sprinkle w/salt and pepper.

Heat a large, heavy ovenproof skillet over high heat. Add chicken cook just until browned, 1 minute per side. Remove from the heat.

Spoon marinara sauce over and around the cutlets. Sprinkle w/mozzarella, 2.6 tsp of Parmesan. Dot tops w/butter pieces bake until cheese melts and chicken is cooked 5 minutes.


